International Olympic Committee: Olympic Solidarity Scholarships for new Master Degree

- The Olympic Solidarity programme is sponsoring up to 6 former Olympian scholars to study on a new and prestigious 2 year Master degree in Sport Ethics and Integrity www.maisi-project.eu
- Successful applicants will join a global cohort of highly motivated students who will go on to develop careers in sport integrity and governance
- Key curriculum topics include anti doping policy; disability sport ethics; gender ethics; good governance; match fixing and event manipulation; safeguarding; sport integrity violations.
- Entry requirement: (i) former Olympian; (ii) bachelor degree; and English Language Certificate (eg IELTS score 6.5, Cambridge Certificate of Proficiency or TOEFL test -total score 90 minimum)

WHAT IS MAiSI?

A two year Erasmus Mundus Joint Master Degree in Sports Ethics and Integrity – an innovative multidisciplinary programme that:

- Is a catalyst for a new profession within sports administration
- Will bring together high level scholars in a consortium of Universities with a focus on professionally orientated concerns
- Equips students for high-level careers in sports administration and governance, concentrating on the development of stronger ethical sports cultures, and developing tools for sports integrity and compliance
- Delivers training that enables students to identify ethical issues, engage in ethical thinking, and translate decisions into ethical actions – the three core skills required to develop sports integrity
- Responds to the greatest contemporary threat to the sports industry – the global challenge to sports integrity innovation for sports administration and governance
